Banana Production

Variety: Cavendish

Cultivation Area: Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos

Planned Area: 25,900 hectares

Annual Output: 1.5 million tons

Harvest Season: Year-round



Bananas are cultivated on a large-scale, specialized model rooted in organic principles and supported by modern technology. This integrated system combines mechanization and biotechnology to ensure sustainable and efficient production. After harvesting, bananas are transported from plantations to packaging facilities via a double pulley system. Here, they are washed, classified, and packed into boxes by automated robots before being placed in cold storage for preservation.

This closed process guarantees stable year-round output, consistent productivity, and premium product quality — meeting the strict requirements of demanding international markets such as Japan.





Mango Production

Varieties: Taiwanese, Australian

Cultivation Area: Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos

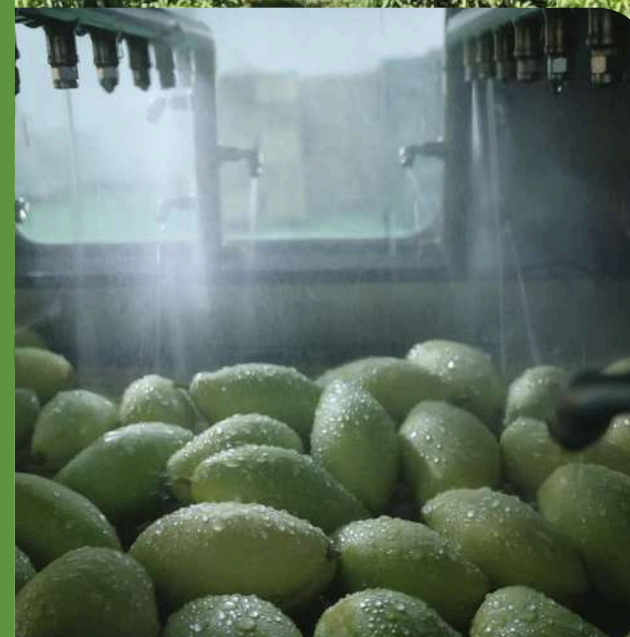
Planned Area: 5,400 hectares

Annual Output: 100,000 tons

Harvest Season: October to May

Mango cultivation is integrated with pasture development for cattle, creating a sustainable ecosystem that balances fruit production with livestock farming. Advanced heat treatment technology is applied to eliminate pathogens while preserving nutrients and flavor, with precise control of temperature and humidity.

As a result, the mangoes produced are rich, fragrant, and irresistibly sweet — consistently meeting the expectations of international consumers and export markets.



Pineapple Production

Variety: MD2

Cultivation Area: Cambodia

Planned Area: 2,100 hectares

Annual Output: 100,000 tons

Harvest Season: September to April

Pineapples are cultivated on a large scale within a closed production system that applies mechanization from land preparation through planting, harvesting, and post-harvest handling. Modern technical processes guided by international expertise ensure uniformity in quality and weight, meeting the expectations of global customers.

Fresh and processed pineapples are preserved in cold storage and transported by specialized vehicles to seaports for export to demanding markets such as Japan. With a Brix level of up to 15, MD2 pineapples feature bright yellow flesh, minimal fiber, crisp texture, abundant juice, and a super-sweet taste — without the tongue-burn often associated with regular varieties.





● *Pomelo Production*

Varieties: Pink flesh & Green skin

Cultivation Area: Cambodia, Laos

Planned Area: 6,300 hectares

Annual Output: 60,000 tons per crop

Harvest Season: Year-round



Pomelo cultivation is integrated with pastures for cattle, creating a natural ecosystem that helps control weeds and limit harmful pests. Farms are supported by systematic technical infrastructure to ensure reliable water supply during dry seasons and effective drainage during rainy periods. This approach maintains stable production and consistent quality. The pink flesh and green skin pomelo features a sweet, juicy taste, vibrant pink-red segments, and thin skin — delivering both high yield and premium quality for international markets.

Durian Production

Variety: Dona (Thai)

Cultivation Area: Vietnam, Cambodia

Planned Area: 2,000 hectares

Annual Output: 40,000 tons per crop

Harvest Season: June to October

Durians are cultivated both exclusively and intercropped with pastures for cattle in areas with favorable soil and climate. This integrated approach creates rich vegetation and beneficial microorganisms, supporting strong and healthy plant growth. Cultivation strictly follows GLOBAL GAP standards to limit pathogens, optimize land use, and ensure superior quality and safety for consumers.

The Dona durian variety is prized for its thick flesh, flat seeds, vibrant yellow color, rich sweetness, and uniquely creamy taste — delivering an unforgettable experience for international markets.



Cattle Breeding

Breed: Australian cattle (beef and breeding)

Livestock Areas: Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos

Planned Area: 29,600 hectares

Herd Size: 455,000 heads

Cattle are raised on a large-scale semi-grazing model across grass farms, which strengthens natural resistance and supports concentrated fattening during later stages to enhance meat quality. Special care methods are applied throughout the process, with tailored TMR (Total Mixed Ration) feed formulations for each breeding stage. This ensures optimal nutrition while avoiding the use of growth stimulants.

The result is a reliable source of beef that guarantees safety and quality. Tender texture and rich flavor make this beef comparable to premium imported varieties, meeting the expectations of both domestic and international markets.





Breeding Swine and Market Hogs

Breeds: Great-grandparent, grandparent, parent swine, gilt, and meat swine

Raising Areas: An Giang, Binh Dinh, Dak Lak (Vietnam)

Planned Area: 1,700 hectares

Herd Size: 594,000 heads

Swine farming is carried out on large-scale, high-tech farms operating within closed production chains. The system covers all stages — from great-grandparent and grandparent swine to parent and meat swine — ensuring consistency and efficiency. These farms integrate forestry cultivation (wood raw materials, medicinal plants) and renewable energy solutions such as solar and biogas, maintaining environmental protection and biosafety standards.

This approach stabilizes output and supports long-term production plans, supplying the domestic market with reliable, high-quality pork.

Animal Feed Factory

Planned Area: 6.8 hectares

Planned Capacity: 300,000 tons/year

The animal feed factory is equipped with advanced Danish technology, featuring fully automated production lines among the most modern in the world. This ensures a stable supply of high-quality feed products for livestock and poultry.

The feed is designed to improve reproductive productivity, meet the growth needs of each stage of livestock development, and reduce feed consumption rates. By meeting strict nutritional standards, the factory supports superior meat quality and consistent output for the market.





Farmed Fish

Breed: Grass carp
Raising Area: Cambodia
Planned Area: 670 hectares
Annual Output: 30,000 tons



Integrated, circular fish farming is applied to optimize water resources across crop and livestock systems. Lakes and dams are developed to store water during the rainy season, support irrigation in the dry season, and provide suitable environments for freshwater fish farming.

Organic wastewater from fish farming is treated in settling ponds, with water quality carefully assessed before reuse in irrigation ponds, storage dams, or directly for grass cultivation around fish ponds. This grass serves as organic feed for the fish, creating a closed, sustainable ecosystem.

The model minimizes environmental impact, improves production efficiency, and reduces costs — delivering a reliable supply of high-quality freshwater fish to domestic and international markets.

Bird Nest Houses

Planned Facilities: 51 birdhouses integrated within livestock complexes in Vietnam, Cambodia, and Laos

Expected Output: 2.2 tons/year

Bird nest houses are strategically developed alongside cattle operations, creating a sustainable ecosystem that maximizes resource use. This integration supports consistent production of high-quality bird nests for domestic and international markets.

Industrial Products – Raw Banana Fiber

Specifications:

- Fiber Length: 800 mm – 1,300 mm
- Fiber Diameter: 0.2 mm – 0.5 mm
- Moisture Content: 12% – 15%
- Appearance: Straight fiber, white to yellow, free of mold, termites, and moths
- Impurities: Guaranteed free of heavy metals; banana flesh residue $\leq 10\%$

Expected Output: 12,500 tons/year
